



2008-2009 Dependent Verification Worksheet

Your application was selected for review in a process called "Verification." In this process, MTC will be comparing information from your application with signed copies of your and your parent(s)' 2007 Federal tax forms, and all W-2 forms or other financial documents. The law says we have the right to ask you for this information before awarding Federal aid.

Deadline: To determine your eligibility for federal and/or state funds, your verification documents must be received by our office no later than August 15, 2009 or 120 days after your last date of enrollment, whichever comes first. Failure to do so by the stated deadline will result in a loss of eligibility for the current academic year.

What You Should Do

1. Collect your and your parent(s)' financial documents (signed Federal income tax forms, W-2 forms, etc.). If you and/or your parents did not file taxes or need a copy of your taxes, contact the IRS at 1-800-829-1040 or print form 4506-T (www.irs.gov).
2. Talk to your financial aid administrator if you have questions about completing this worksheet.
3. Fill in and sign the worksheet-you and at least one parent.
4. Take the completed worksheet, copies of the tax forms, and any other documents MTC needs to your financial aid administrator.
5. Your financial aid administrator will compare information on the documents. You will be notified of any corrections required by you or processed electronically by MTC.
6. If your 2007 household income is \$10,400 or below you must complete and attach Section C of the Clarification Statement.

MTC must review the requested information, under the financial aid program rules (34 CFR, Part 668).
